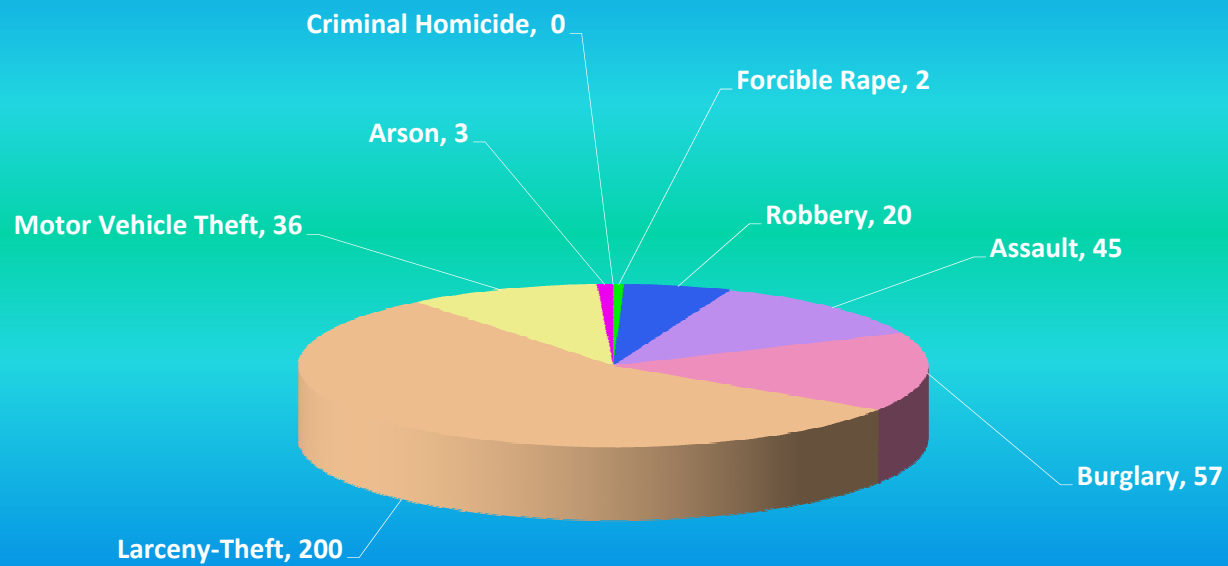

Definitions

Criminal Homicide *"The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human by another."*

Forcible Rape *"The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will."*

Robbery *"Taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear."*

Aggravated Assault *"An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury."*

This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.

Burglary *"The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft."*

Also counted as burglary are: "offenses locally known as burglary (any degree), unlawful entry with intent to commit a larceny or felony, breaking and entering with intent to commit a larceny, housebreaking, safecracking, and all attempts at these offenses."

Larceny-theft *"The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another."*

Larceny **includes** shoplifting, pick-pocketing, purse snatching (if force was used to overcome resistance it would be a robbery), thefts from motor vehicles, thefts from vehicles, thefts of vehicle parts and accessories, bicycles, and from coin-operated machines.

Larceny **does not include** motor vehicle theft, embezzlement, counterfeiting, larceny by check, or check fraud.

Motor Vehicle Theft *"The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle."*

Motor Vehicles **include** sport utility vehicles, automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, motor scooters, all-terrain vehicles and snowmobiles. Motor Vehicles **do not include** farm equipment, bulldozers, airplanes, construction equipment, or water craft.

Arson *"Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc."*

Quoted crime definitions are based on the *Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program Handbook: U.S. Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation*. Definitions are standardized for all law enforcement agencies. CA Penal Code definitions may differ.
